I spent 5 days in beautiful Cura Huasi about 2 hours from here for the inauguration of a brand new hospital built specifically for the Quechua people—the descendants of the Inca Indians. This hospital is an answer to prayer for thousands of people and will be one of the best in Peru! It is German run (with some 30+ Germans working there) and will see another 30 or so Peruvians join them when the hospital officially opens in December or around there. For those who know me well and know how much I love music, this week saw me playing drums about 8 hours a day, so no complaints here:) Over 4,000 people showed up for the inauguration of the hospital including the first lady of Peru (which was a pretty big deal). I played with a band from Lima and played everything from Latin to Jazz and Rock (it was sort of a festival atmosphere). It was really interesting... On Saturday and Sunday we held a youth event and then a massive church service with 15 or 20 evangelical churches from the region, all in the amphitheater attached to the hospital. Thanks to everyone for your prayers while I was traveling (without Jaime) and Jaime was home with Keira. Except for a leaky toilet, Jaime didn't have any problems. Of course today some wiring fried when I turned on the electric shower and dryer at the same time, but fortunately that didn't happen while I was gone:)

On a side note, God has opened up a lot of doors at one time this past week and we already have some plans for this next summer ministry-wise as well as people interested in working with us. We will be sharing our expanding vision with you all over the next few months as God continues to develop things.
